**FROM THE INTERIM PASTOR . . . Rev. Dr. Stephanie Weiner**

The Saturday All Church discussion went so well, I've been quoting information from it ever since. We watched a Ted Talk by Simon Sinek, "How Great Leaders Inspire Action." I commend it to you. Sinek refers to the Golden Circle, three concentric circles. Sounds like a Trinitarian format to me.

The center circle is why, the next is how, the third, moving outward is what. Sinek says that if we start with why, the how and what will flow more naturally and they will be more pertinent. Good advice, especially to those of us who rush to the "What?"

A personal, even a bit self-revealing and trivial example, when I go into the kitchen to see "What?" I can snack on, I should ask "Why?" first. If it is because I'm hungry, my body needs fuel, I'm looking for nutrition, then I should move to the how and the what. That will probably end in my eating more apples than chocolates.

It is the same with the church and our faith. A wise member of the Leadership Council suggested at the conclusion of the February meeting that we should measure every action by whether it will help us grow the church. Why are we doing whatever we are doing? Does it help us grow the church?

That leads me to another question, "Why do we want to grow the church?" I'd invite you to think that through with me, with your Nine to Dine group, or Sunday School class, or luncheon or breakfast group.

Among my many answers (we can always have more than one, we just have to make sure one of them is the most important answer and we know which one it is): God calls us into the church to accept the cost and joy of discipleship (from the UCC Statement of Faith); because we want to be part of the body of Christ; because we have good news to share; because we see ways to better ourselves and our society. I'm eager to hear your answers.

When the "Why?" question is addressed to the Lenten practice of giving something up, one answer is "to make room for God." That is the driving force behind the Lenten Series, on becoming "Unbusy." I hope to see you a lot during Lent, March 6-April 21. But first, join me for "The National Day of Unplugging," Friday, March 1, sundown to Saturday, March 2, sundown.

Many of us think of giving up something for Lent. Marcia McFee expands that to say we need to give things up in order to make room – for God, as well as for our best selves.



She encourages us to have a particular chair and a particular time to reflect on scripture, to meditate, to just be for at least ten minutes a day. Now is a great time to pick out that chair! Add a candle or music. Put it by a window. Oh, that it was warm enough to sit outside!

We will have communion on March 10, the first Sunday in Lent, as is our custom.

March is also the month to receive our One Great Hour of Sharing Offering, a disaster and development offering for Church World Service. This enables us to be responsive as soon as a disaster happens and to work developmentally so that they are not as likely to happen.

The focus for the month and for the Round Table is food insecurity and what we can do about it, especially using resources from Bread for the World.

Members can post to the page and I run the page, so I can post to it and keep the youth and parents up to date with what is going on. All upcoming events would be available to see on the calendar as soon as I am notified about them. So you and the youth would be able to look ahead to see what they have going on church wise.

**March 17:** Indiana ranks 11<sup>th</sup> in terms of people who are food insecure. Come, learn with us about what we can do and, then, let's do it!


