The excitement builds: We are pleased that the Diversion Center is almost a reality. Many have asked, "When will it open?" Answer: We can't open until we hire staff. We can't hire staff until we know how many nights we can function. While the County Commissioners are recommending the \$500,000 amount to the County Council, that vote has not been taken. We hope the vote will happen soon. Then, we can count on the \$500,000 from the county in addition to the \$300,000 we are assured from the city. Given that, we expect to open by the beginning of 2023. "In the unlikely event, we don't get the \$500,000, we will evaluate the possibility to open on a less than ideal, reduced scale with the city's \$300,000 and any support we receive from local stakeholders in and beneficiaries of the program Thanks for asking; thanks for supporting us. "Uncage" Justice:

Bethel is a member of CAJE: Congregations Acting for Justice and Empowerment. On July 17, it was our privilege to host our newly assigned organizer, Yvonne Martin; to thank Janel Allen for serving as our Team Leader; and to think again about how we are involved in doing justice as well as loving kindness and walking humbly with God, (Micah 6:8). It was great to have 21 at the spring's Nehemiah Action Assembly, our yearly accountability gathering. It is great to have 20 members on our Bethel Justice Network. Our next involvement will be to have members at the vote of the County Council on the \$500,000 requested for the Diversion Center, date and time to be appounced stay tuned.



Turning Green:

As so many parts of the world experience life threatening heat and devastating droughts. We are so fortunate to have air conditioning and water. Still, we are part of God's global family. What we do affects our brothers and sisters, as well as ourselves. The Department of Energy <u>estimates savings</u> of about 1 percent for each degree of thermostat adjustment per 8 hours, and <u>recommends turning thermostats back</u> or up 7 to 10 degrees from their normal settings for 8 hours per day to achieve annual savings of up to 10%. Heating and cooling your home makes up about half of your energy bill, using more energy and costing more money than any other system in the house.



Whether you knit, sew, crochet, or have NO CRAFT SKILLS at all, you can participate!

Prayer shawls can be triangular, rectangular, or square, and generally sized to go around an adult's shoulders or be used as a lap blanket.

You can make them with yarn, fleece, or any other material.



A target number right now is to have 650 prayer shawls to come from our respective churches. At the IKC Annual Meeting in 2023, we hope to begin to assemble and display the shawls and bless the shawls.
