"Possibilities Abound"

Over the years, many of our faithful members who believe in the ministry of Bethel UCC have chosen to give legacy gifts to Bethel. Some have chosen to name Bethel in their wills as a recipient of a portion of their estate. Others have chosen to name Bethel as a direct recipient of funds such as IRA's or other investment funds. Whenever Bethel has received these funds, on each occasion it has allowed Bethel to move forward in its ministry in a way it could not have otherwise. In the recent years, some of these gifts have allowed us to remodel and upgrade our facility so that it is now the beautiful building that you see today. A recent gift allowed us to install the solar array that produces most of our electrical needs over the course of the year and made us less dependent upon fossil fuels for our energy needs. The installation of the solar array helps us to live into our vision of caring for God's creation.

Recently we were informed that Larry Appman had named Bethel as the beneficiary of several of his investment funds. Knowing of Larry's generosity to Bethel, another member stepped forward and approached the Mission Team and the Leadership Council with the following proposal. Believing that the church is at its best when it is reaching out and serving others and knowing that Habitat for Humanity holds a special place in the history and ministry of Bethel, he proposed the following. He would like to see Bethel raise enough money to fund a house for Habitat for Humanity. The goal would be to raise \$80,000. To make that happen, he and his wife would make a gift of \$25,000 to Bethel if we would be willing to match it with \$25,000 from Larry Appman's legacy gift. We would then need to raise the remaining \$30,000. Both the Mission Team and the Leadership Council are in support this endeavor. On October 17 th, the Leadership Council passed a motion to use a portion of Larry's moneys to match the gift of \$25,000. We are already aware that there has been another pledge of \$5,000 made toward this goal.

As a way of honoring Larry and his passion for helping veterans, it was decided that the home would be built in Larry's name and that it be offered to a veteran in which to live. We talked with Habitat for Humanity and they thought this was a great idea. In fact, they informed us that they have a group of veterans who would be more than willing to be the volunteers on the build. What a wonderful way to honor that legacy gift of Larry's and his passion for helping veterans.

Would you join us in helping to meet this goal of raising \$80,000? We already have \$55,000 pledged and only need to raise an additional \$25,000. Please helps us turn this dream into a reality.

Also, if you are able, please consider naming Bethel UCC in your will or as a beneficiary of some of your funds. By so doing, long after you and I are gone, Bethel could continue to do some amazing work.
