"Making a Difference"

Over the past several decades, anyone who is remotely aware of the church and the role that churches play in this country, has observed the decline in attendance and membership especially among the younger generations. One of my retired colleagues in ministry with whom I chat often shared with me that not only his grown grandchildren but now also his children, all of whom grew up in the church, see the church as being less and less relevant in their lives. Recently when I pushed him on this he shared that especially for his grandchildren they are looking for organizations that are making a difference in people's lives in the here and now. They concern is not an afterlife but is this life.


With that thought in mind I want to use this space to share with you how Bethel has recently made a difference in several folks lives. In mid-December I received the following email from a colleague in ministry "I have been working with a family in Henderson originally from Honduras, trying to deal with I.C.E. and related craziness. The father in that family says that he knows of a family recently from Haiti staying in his neighborhood. They haven't got beds -- have been sleeping on the floor (parents and I think a couple of kids.) Father has a job that covers rent and some other basics, but they have no car, no phone, no English and not a lot of Spanish. Are you aware of any resources that they might connect with for some help? The guy I've been working with and a friend of his are looking around at thrift stores etc. today, but even if they find some things, there's not really any money there to purchase items." Within hours of receiving that email, through Bethel's generosity we delivered \$250 to this colleague so that there would be money available to follow through the purchases at the thrift store. We later learned that one of the children was a 2-month old infant.

Then just a couple of days before Christmas, a father stopped by the church wondering if we could help with his electric bill. He and his family had immigrated some time ago from Mexico and he works for a local roofing company. But over the holidays there was no roofing work to be done. He and his wife had two children under the ages of ten. With no money for his electric bill, there was also no money to purchase Christmas gifts for the two boys. It just so happened that in the prior week Bethel had been gifted with a box full of new stuffed animals. He picked out two dinosaurs that he knew his boys would like. As he walked out the door with his electric bill paid in full and two stuffed animals under his arm, I saw him raise his head to the sky, give the sign of the cross as he gave God thanks. It brought tears to my eyes to know that we all, you all, just made a big difference for a local family.

I am proud to be a part of a church that is doing this good work in the here and now.
