## MISSION FOCUS - DECEMBER 2023 UCC CHRISTMAS FUND



Rev. Don Bernhardt and I have been fortunate to serve as Annuitant Visitors for the Pension Boards of the United Church of Christ, staying in touch with about 30 retired clergy or their surviving spouses in the Evansville area. I have also served on the Florida and the Indiana-Kentucky Conference staff.

In these positions, I have realized how blessed I have been to serve churches that pay a living wage. I've also been fortunate not to have a catastrophic illness or a life-changing/finance-draining situation. Not so for all my colleagues. Not so for many clergy who have served those most in need.

The Christmas Offering for Veterans of the Cross is the response of the church to clergy who have sudden unmet financial needs or who have not been fairly compensated for their ministry. This year's theme is "Grace Upon Grace. Our offering last year was \$1245. The inflation rate as of Nov. 14 was 3.2%, meaning it would take \$1284.84 to do the same good work in 2023.

God has been generous to us. The Christmas offering is our opportunity to respond to God's graciousness, with grace. What do you say we round up and set a goal for 2023 of \$1300? With gratitude and hope, Stephanie Weiner
