## REPORT ON THE SOW HOPE SCHOOL IN NIGERIA

This was a Mission Focus in August 2023



This past June, Sarah Maigari's ministry in Nigeria was celebrated in two ways. First, her family and friends gathered for a service to place a wreath of flowers on her grave in commemoration of her death one year ago.

Secondly, (And this would have been the most exciting for Sarah), the roof was put on the second story of the Sow Hope International School! The school had been functioning, in spite of the fact that the building was

incomplete. Now, students and staff are thrilled!


The school is blessed with a good principal, five teachers, two security guards, and two custodians. There are 36 pupils in grades 1st - 6th (ages 4 to 12). There are 28 in secondary level grades 7th - 9th (ages 13 to 26), for a total of 64 students. The curriculum includes Math, English, Basic Science, and Social Science. It is a technical school, so there are also classes to teach practical skills for job training.

Each student pays 15,000 naira (approximately \$9.53) for a semester. This is minuscule to us, but for many of the families in the area, even that is a



significant sacrifice. The school plans to grow slowly as they can afford to pay more teachers. They are working hard to provide a quality education and sustain the school program.

Sarah's niece, Elizabeth Akson is the person who sent us this information. She helps to supervise


