

MISSION FOCUS - OCTOBER 2025 - NEIGHBORS IN NEED

"Rarely have I seen a church without some form of ministry that helps feed people. From community meals to food pantries, churches across the country make sure people have enough to eat. But I always wondered, wouldn't it be better if none of these services had to exist. What if everyone simply had enough to eat?

Our churches share compassion by not only providing for the basic needs of our neighbors but also asking deeper questions of why these inequalities exist in the first place. Our immediate call to alleviate the suffering of those around us is paired with a prophetic witness calling for systemic reform.



All congregations in the United Church of Christ are invited to take part in the **Neighbors in Need** offering to address just this. Two thirds of the offering support justice and witness ministries of the United Church of Christ with one third of the offering given to the Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Your gifts directly fund the Neighbors in Need grant program. This grant, for UCC congregations and partners, offers funding for both direct service and advocacy projects.

The Rev. Rachel McDonald works for the National Ministries of the UCC as Generosity Officer, OCWM and Special Mission Offerings. The four Special Mission Offerings of the United Church of Christ are One Great Hour of Sharing, Strengthen the Church, Neighbors in Need, and the Christmas Fund. Bethel United Church of Christ Leadership Council Meeting Summary September 9, 2025

Continuing Business:

- 1. Lawsuit: Ron Vogel and Sam Buehrer met with our attorney. A trial date has been set for September 2026. He does not expect to see much movement on the lawsuit until after the first of the year. He continues to hope for mediation as the end result.
- 2. Sabbatical: Christy Woywood and Sam Buehrer have finalized the expenses. Over all expenses were right at the budgeted amount of the money that the Lilly Foundation had granted us. A final report now needs to be prepared and submitted to the Lilly Foundation.
- 3. We are proceeding with the sanctuary roof replacement and the sidewalk construction. We collected over \$32,000 toward the expenses. The remaining amount of around \$25,000 will be covered by the bequest from Jim Vogel.

New Business:

- 1. Altheide Bequest: The monies from this bequest will be invested in a similar manner as the Endowment monies are invested. The income from the bequest investment will be treated in a similar manner as the income from the Endowment is determined and utilized.
- 2. 2026 Budget Process: We are beginning to make preparations on the 2026 budget.

Financials:

- 1. Our Operating Income is behind budget by \$47,000. Expenses are less than \$5,000 over budget. The shortfall in income is largely due to lower than expected contributions. We are researching the cause of the decrease.
- 2. Bethel Buddies: Income is running behind expenses by \$28,900 for the year. Due to many changes by the State of Indiana related to preschools, as a result our program has suffered a significant loss in income and a loss of students. With the change to enrolling 2 ½ year old's, we are hopeful that this will move us into a positive financial position in the near future. We are cautiously optimistic that the changes that we have implemented in the past month are positioning us to break even for the month of September and place on in a better financial position in the coming months.


